
Year 12 Introduction to Higher Education Talk

Work Experience

Year 11 to Year 13 – Oxford University Hospitals – One week

The Work Experience can be in Life Sciences that allows students to get a taster of all the pathology disciplines within Healthcare Science (microbiology, histopathology, clinical biochemistry, haematology, immunology, genetics) or Microbiology only in which students spend the week getting a full picture of bacteria, viruses, parasites and more and how we diagnose and provide details of treatment.

For either of this experiences students will be asked to provide an email (covering letter) detailing why they would like to undertake the programme, a one-page CV snapshot and the potential dates they would like to attend. We do our upmost to accommodate specific dates, but if there is a little flexibility, it would be hugely appreciated. That way we hope not to disappoint.
