Lessons from Auschwitz

On Tuesday 5th March, we went on a day trip to Krakow, Poland with the National Holocaust Trust to visit the town of Oswiecim, Auschwitz One and Auschwitz Birkenau. In the town of Oswiecim, we visited the Jewish Museum and Synagogue where we learnt about Jewish life in Poland before the Nazi occupation and the construction of Auschwitz. We then visited Memorial and Museum Auschwitz One, where we delved into various exhibitions including displays of shoes, prosthetic limbs, glasses and suitcases brought to Auschwitz by Jewish victims. There was also a display of all of the pots and pans brought by the Jews who thought that they were being resettled. We were also given the opportunity to walk through the first gas chamber built at Auschwitz. Later in the day, we went to Auschwitz Birkenau, where we walked along the train track and under the main gate entrance. We were shown the barracks and the latrine blocks where the people were made to live. Before we left for the airport we held a ceremony to remember all of the victims of the Holocaust, where we lit candles and heard some poetry written by Jewish victims of the Holocaust.

It was a thoroughly enjoyable hour and their knowledge and presentation skills were both really impressive.
