








Why Should I Study Religious Studies?

What Will I Study?

- We follow the AQA A specification, which covers religious, philosophical and ethical thought and teaching.
- Component 1: Beliefs, Teachings and Practices in Christianity and Islam. This
 component covers beliefs and teachings about the nature of God, the
 afterlife, authority, as well as exploring a wide range of religious practices
 and festivals.
- Component 2: Themes We study four themes Theme A:
- Theme A: Relationships and families
- Theme B: Religion and Life
- Theme D: Religion, Peace and Conflict
- Theme E: Religion, Crime and Punishment









What Will Religious Studies Lessons Be Like?


- We will have lots of debate and discussion

- Fun and engaging






How Will I Be Assessed?

- 2 x Written exams of 1 hour 45 minutes
- 96 marks, plus 6 marks for spelling, punctuation and grammar (Christianity and Islam paper)
- 96 marks, plus 3 marks for spelling, punctuation and grammar (thematic studies)
- 100% of GCSE
- There is a common structure of a five-part question of 1, 2, 4, 5 and 12 marks per topic


